4-H STEM Outreach: Engineering Adventures Program

4-H is a youth development program open to all youth, ages 5-18, through clubs, camps, school enrichment, and OST education. It is overseen nationally by the USDA, and locally by University

of Illinois Extension. Engineering Adventures contains six sessions in which students participate in hands-on activities as they learn about the engineering design cycle. The lessons also illustrate more specific STEM concepts and Next Generation Science Standards.

The goals of this program are: 1) to get young people more excited about STEM subjects 2) provide hands-on activities to classrooms that may not have the resources to include in their curriculum 3) introduce local youth to 4-H.
