Classroom Feature

What is Daily 5?

This is a framework that helps best organize time during our Guided Reading time to ensure students are engaged in meaningful reading and writing activities. It encourages reading independence and gives children the skills needed to create a lifetime love of reading and writing. It consists of five tasks that were introduced individually. It is modeled and supported by teachers throughout implementation. It is not something that was implemented in a week. When each task was introduced, students discuss what it looks like, sounds like, and feels like to engage in the task independently. There are specific student behaviors associated with each of the tasks, and there is also a focus on continuing to build a strong classroom community! Students then work towards building "stamina" until they successfully achieve independence.

Daily 5 tasks include:

- 1. Read-to-Self: Read AR books
- 2. Read-to-Someone: Read Partner Books with a classmate
- 3. Listen-to-Reading: Listen to reading on EPIC or at our classroom listening center
- 4. Work-on-Writing: Work on our writing piece
- 5. Word Work: Do activities from our "Words Their Way" Board

When students can read and write independently during these times, it allows me the opportunity to work with small groups of students to teach and reinforce essential reading skills. Students LOVE this time and cheer when I announce, "It's Daily 5 time!" It is exciting watching students love to read in school!
